Decision points:

1. What are the differences for browsing?
C: Depends on how you enter, what you are looking for?
C: Direct is more natural. Indirect is counter-intuitive from natural language point of view. May depend on the user, which would collocate best. But direct seems more natural
2. How do the rules correlate with expectations
3. What if the name had been Episcopal Church Diocese of Jerusalem Friends
C: Type 6 is somewhat artificial—
Yale University Library → Yale University. Library; but
Cambridge University Library → Cambridge University Library [because the name of the university is University of Cambridge]

Conclusion: Latter form of entry is correct

Date: Refers to the 1997 constitution; bibliography has publications from 2004

Question: Is there a definitive reference source for Government bodies in Africa?

1. Already established:
2. US Dept of State Country Reports: has a statement about this: "The Department of Women's Affairs, under the Office of the Vice President..."
3. List of contacts:
Office of the Vice President and the Department of State for Defense;
Department of State for Health, Social Welfare, and Women's Affairs
4. Documentation site with case law (SIM): Structures have been put in place ... and the Department of State for Women's Affairs under the Office of the Vice President.
5. Another site: Office of the Vice President ... for Women's Affairs

Questions

C: Probably not more than one of these departments.

C: Not enough information to relate this body to the other forms found.
3. What information sources need to be consulted:
 - a. Publication issued by the body: but this may have variant forms
 - b. Web site of the body (counts as a publication of the body): useful for establishing headings for societies

Conclusion: Enter indirectly, omitting the intervening part of the hierarchy.

Add the following field to any record that has CD-ROM (or the equivalent) as the primary material (i.e., CD-ROM or equivalent terminology is present in the 300 \$a):

We don't do this for videocassettes, for audiocassettes, or accompanying materials for YRL; but Biomed DOES add 655 for accompanying materials.
